UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE ON TRADE AND EMPLOYMENT.Corrigendum to Verbatim Report of Thirty-third Meeting
of Commission A
(E/PC/T/A/PV/33)

The following corrections should be made to the remarks of
Mr. Leddy (U.S.):

P.13 - Delete the phrase "it is a little different and" in
lines 10 and 11.

P.20 - The sentence beginning on line 11 should read as
follows:

"Therefore we thought it well to draft provisions
which would take care of real security interests and,
at the same time, so far as we could, to limit the
exception so as to prevent the adoption of protection
for maintaining industries under every conceivable
circumstance."

P.20 - The paragraph beginning on line 16 should read as
follows:

"With regard to subparagraph (e), the limitation,
I think, is primarily in the time. First, 'in time of
war'. I think no one would question the need of a
Member, or the right of a Member, to take action relat-
ing to its security interests in time of war and to
determine for itself -- which I think we cannot deny --
what its security interests are."

P.24 - The sentence beginning on line 1 should read as fol-
lows:

"We might well add a provision permitting restric-
tions on the export of unpatented technology, and so
have all three branches of production on the same basis."

P.29 - The three sentences beginning on line 1 should read
as follows:

"If we put in a note of this kind in respect of
Article 94 I think it may raise doubts elsewhere in the
Charter. Therefore I would rather not see that kind of
note. In order to prevent the application of Article 35
to Article 94, I think we would have to have a clear and
explicit provision in Article 35 saying that no Member
shall bring any complaint in respect of measures taken
pursuant to Article 94. Since it is perfectly clear from
the existing text that Article 35 does apply to Article
94, I would rather have it left that way, without the
addition of a note emphasizing what is clear from the
text."
